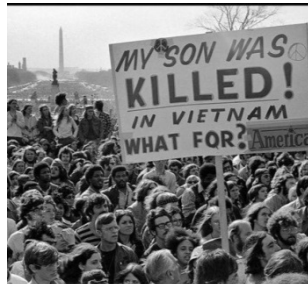

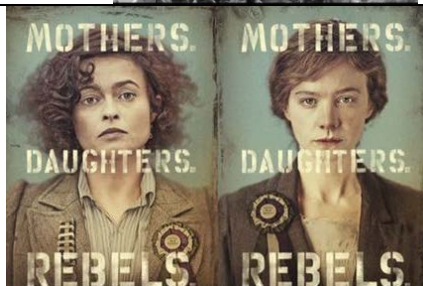

Course descriptions

History of Art: -‘This course is for you if you are interested in typically misunderstood genres in Art. ‘The first session will look at Conceptual Art: ‘How can that load of old bricks be Art?’ The second - Abstract Expressionism: ‘I could have painted that splodge of paint myself’ and the third - Symbolism in Art: ‘What’s so interesting about a painting of two people in a room?’

Exploring Feminism: This course is for you if you are interested in the role of women in society. The first session will look at the three ‘waves’ of feminist thinking in the 20th century; the second will look at studies in masculinity and the third will explore the role gender around the world.

Relativizing the Holocaust – This course aims to examine the various ways in which European countries have attempted to downplay or relativize the meaning of the Holocaust. The first session will explore how post-1945 there was an attempt to compare Nazism with repression in the Soviet Union and to minimise public discussion on the Genocide. The second session will explore how, since the 1990s, regional civil wars in Croatia and Rwanda have been presented as ‘another’ Holocaust. The third session will examine how the promiscuous use of ‘Holocausts’ has contributed to a new wave of Anti-Semitism.

Law and Human Rights: This course is for you if you are interested in learning about the theory and practice of law. The first session will consider Human Rights Law following the Holocaust, the second session will ask the question ‘What is Tort Law?’ and the third session will look at a variety of interesting and amusing Criminal Law cases.

Psychology: This course is for you if you are interested in learning about what makes us behave the way we do. Year 13 Psychology students will be running some interactive activities during some of the sessions. The first session will look at how the brain influences behaviour as well as differences between males and female. The second will look at non-verbal behaviour, with a focus on lying. The last session will look at IQ, the origins of IQ and some common misconceptions.

Best of Ted: This course is for you if you enjoy learning about something new each time. TED is a world-wide educational movement where people give short lectures on a theme. Each week a different sixth form presenter will give an inspirational and interesting talk on a topic of their choice. Of course there will be plenty of time for Q&A.

The Origins of the Vietnam Conflict: This course is for you if you are interested in modern conflict and its origins. The first session will look at ‘why Vietnam?’ what was significant about this country and region of the world. The second will look at the origins of the conflict and the third will explore post WWII problems and the domino theory.

Theory of Warfare: This course is for those that are interested in a whirlwind tour of some of the strategies which have underpinned military thinking since the dawn of warfare.
