At JFS we consider how our pupils may be taught about safeguarding, including online, through teaching and learning opportunities, as part of providing a broad and balanced curriculum. This includes covering relevant issues through Personal, Social Health and Economic education (PSHE), and through Relationship and Sex Education (RSE). We are also committed to drawing on the experience of external groups and visitors such as our local Safer Schools Police Officers and others to deliver assemblies and workshops on specialist areas throughout the academic year.
