

### **Year 13 A Level Mock Examinations**

The Year 13 A Level Mock Examinations will begin on **Monday 10<sup>th</sup> January** and will finish on **Friday 21<sup>st</sup> January 2022**; please [CLICK HERE](#) for the Year 13 Examination Timetable. Students will be on study leave from the 5<sup>th</sup> until the 21<sup>st</sup> of January. However, they are invited to attend their timetabled subject lessons between the 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> of January, if they wish, in order to revise. Students who attend school to revise before, or during the examination period, should sign in with Mrs Bull in M110.

Earlier this term I sent out the instructions, regulations and warnings published by the Joint Council for Qualifications. In addition, please [CLICK HERE](#) for Year 13 Mock Examination Guidance for Students. Please ensure you have read though all this information thoroughly in order to adhere to the regulations and avoid any possibility of disqualification.

**For 2021/2022 the JCQ (Joint Council for Qualifications) have asked schools to report any incidents of malpractice in mock exams/assessments to the relevant awarding organisation which will then provide further guidance on the next steps, including details of any sanctions to be applied.**

Year 13 Mock Examinations are run using the same rules that apply to A-Level examinations, therefore failure to comply with the regulations will result in your paper being disqualified. In accordance with JCQ regulations, you must have identification with you when you are in the examination room, therefore you will only be permitted to enter the examination room if you have your lanyard on you.

You are also expected to fully adhere to the Sixth Form Dress Code when sitting examinations and if you come into school to revise. Students who fail to comply with the Dress Code will not be allowed in the examination room, unless they are able to rectify their clothing. Therefore, it is essential that you come to school on the day of your examinations in the correct attire.

The majority of students will take their exams in the Main Hall and all students should go to the Amphitheatre to wait to be called into the exam room. If you are taking your examination in a different room, you will be notified in advance. Students in alternate rooms should go straight there, in advance of the start of their examination.

Registration for these examinations is at **8.30am** (for a 9.00am start) for morning exams and **12.30pm** (for a 1.00pm start) for afternoon exams (**11.45am** for a 12.00pm start on Friday afternoons). It is your responsibility to ensure that you are there in good time. **Please note the duration of your afternoon exams, in case you need to make alternative arrangements for travelling home.**

**All wrist watches and mobile phones are not allowed in the exam room. Please ensure that these are locked away in your locker (or Pastoral Office if you do not have a locker) before you come to the exam room.**
