Respect civil and criminal law

Through PSHE, students learn about the law in regards to the following:

- Drug, tobacco and alcohol use
- Legal and illegal substances
- Online activity
- Age of consent
- Pornography
- Forced marriage, coercive and abusive relationships
- FGM
- Gambling
- Personal safety at work and online incl' abusive relationships
- Legal rights incl' the Equality act and protected characteristics
- Legal position on abortion
- Organized crime and cybercrime – how and why young people get involved
- Carrying a weapon – the law

Tolerance of those with different viewpoints / Appreciate viewpoints of others on ethical issues

Through the study of PSHE students develop a knowledge, appreciation and understanding of:

- Racism and discrimination
- Conflict resolution
- Strategies to cope with bullying and harassment, responding to coercion
- Skills for team working
- the similarities, differences and diversity among people of different race, culture, ability, sex, gender identity, age and sexual orientation

Acceptance and engagement with fundamental British values of democracy

Through the study of PSHE students develop a knowledge, appreciation and understanding of democracy through:

- skills needed for team work

Contribute positively to life in Modern Britain

Through the study of PSHE students develop a knowledge, appreciation and understanding of:

- Sexual relationships and choices, consent
- Pregnancy, contraception, abortion
- Role and responsibilities of parents and carers
- Making financial decisions
- Developing a career identity and pathway, high aspirations, employment skills
- The unacceptability of harassment and discrimination in the workplace
- The role of social media and influence of the internet, establishing an online identity.
- Recognizing extremism and exploitation and how to deal with it.
- Establishing personal boundaries and values
- The diversity in romantic relationships, benefits of strong relationships
- Gangs – legal and physical consequences of joining one
- Developing resilience, good mental and physical health. Dealing with bereavement and loss.
- How to deal with an emergency situation, harmful behaviours and addiction

Individual liberty / fighting extremism

Through the study of PSHE students develop a knowledge and understanding of:

- How the internet and social media can radicalize someone
- Strategies of where to get help online
- The consequences of extremism, gang culture, where to get help
- Social risks of drug and alcohol use, where to get help
- Risk factors that affect young people getting involved in crime

Respect for those with different beliefs, faith and cultures

- Racism and discrimination; the need to promote inclusion and challenge discrimination, and how to do so safely, including online
- Recognizing faith and other cultural views of relationships and respecting them
- Protected characteristics and the Equality act
- Impact of racism and stereotyping
- the unacceptability of prejudice-based language including sexism, homophobia, biphobia, transphobia, racism, ableism and faith-based prejudice
- the similarities, differences and diversity among people of different race, culture, ability, sex, gender identity, age and sexual orientation
